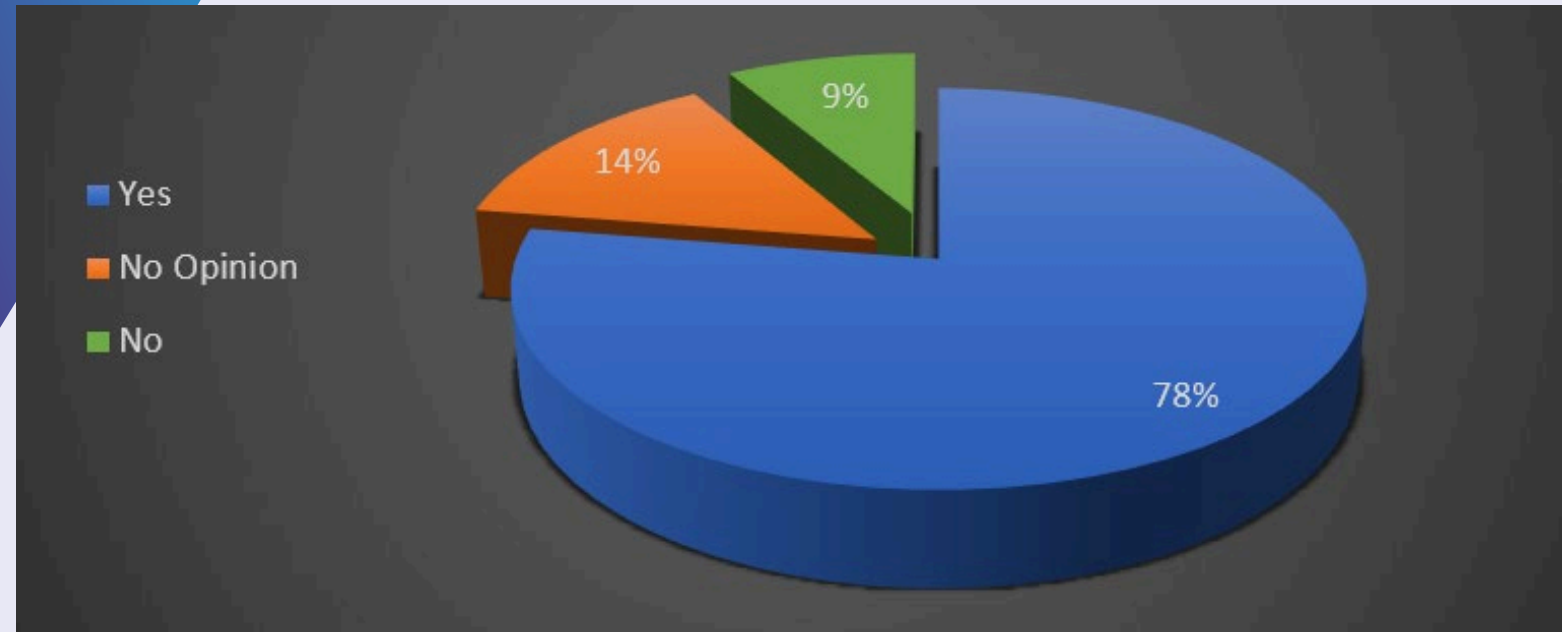

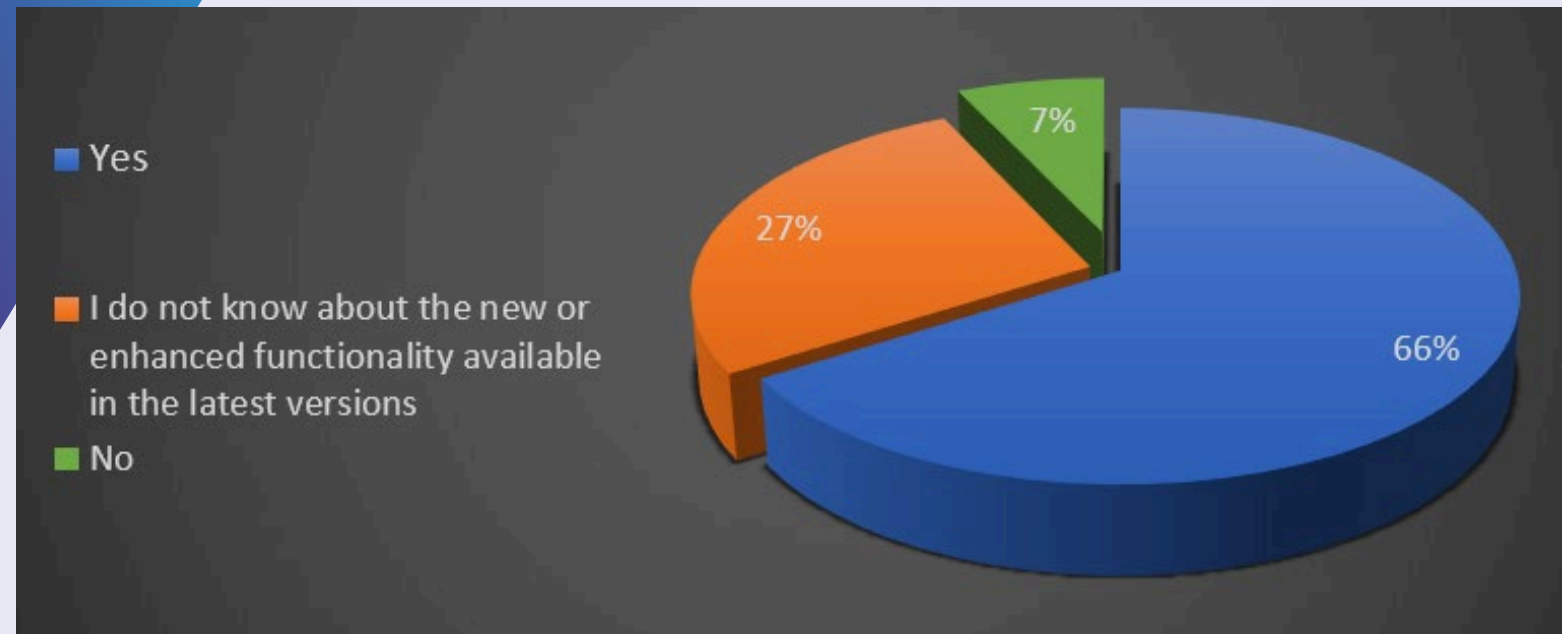
SUMMARY OF RESULTS

The overwhelming majority of respondents support X12 recommending mandated adoption the latest version



SUMMARY OF RESULTS: 2

Most were aware of new or enhanced functionality that will benefit their organization



SUMMARY OF RESULTS: 3

Which guides are important components of your organization's EDI functionality?

- Respondents indicated nearly all the currently mandated Implementation Guides as well as several of those not mandated by HIPAA are in fact important components of their organization's EDI functionality

SUMMARY OF RESULTS: 3A

Which guides are important components of your organization's EDI functionality?

→ The majority indicated that eight of the nine current HIPAA mandated guides are important components of their EDI functionality:

- 81% - X332 - Eligibility (270/271)
- 84% - X323, 324, 325 - Claims (837)
- 77% - X329 - Claim Status (276/277)
- 86% - X322 - Remittance Advice (835)
- 61% - X333 - Enrollment and Maintenance (834)
- 64% - X342 - Health Care Services Review (278)

SUMMARY OF RESULTS: 3B

Which guides are important components of your organization's EDI functionality?

→ The majority indicated three of the non-mandated guides are important components, additionally one was evenly split:

- 67% - X330 - Claim Acknowledgment (277)
- 64% - X335 - Implementation Ack. (999)
- 53% - X340 - Request for Add'tl Information (277)
- 50% - X327 - Health Care Services Review (278)

SUMMARY OF RESULTS: 3C

Which guides are important components of your organization's EDI functionality?

→ Four additional non-mandated guides had more than 40% of materially impacted respondents indicating they were important components of their EDI functionality:

- 49% - X328 - *Health Care Services Review (278)*
- 47% - X341 - *Additional Information to Support a Health Care Claim or Encounter (275)*
- 41% - X343 - *Additional Information to Support a Health Care Services Review (275)*
- 40% - X346 - *HIE: Enrollment (834)*

SUMMARY OF RESULTS: 4

Of the non-mandated guides listed, which would benefit your organization if mandated?

→ Results vary widely by the category of organizations surveyed, but a majority consensus in favor of mandating was reached for only one of the non-mandated implementation guides surveyed.

SUMMARY OF RESULTS: 4A

Of the non-mandated guides listed, which would benefit your organization if mandated?

→ Only one of the sixteen guides referenced in this question was selected by a majority of respondents when asked:

"Of the non-mandated implementation guides listed below, select those that would benefit your organization if mandated."

- *X330 - Claim Acknowledgment (277), with 53% in favor*



SUMMARY OF RESULTS: 4B

Of the non-mandated guides listed, which would benefit your organization if mandated?

→ Additionally, 6 of the 16 were selected by 40% or more of materially impacted respondents indicated mandating them would benefit their organizations:

- 43% - X327 - *Services Review – Inquiry and Response (278)*
- 40% - X328 - *Services Review – Notification and Acknowledgment (278)*
- 45% - X335 - *Implementation Acknowledg. (999)*
- 46% - X340 - *Request for Add'tl Information (277)*
- 45% - X341 - *Add'tl Info. to Support a Claim (275)*
- 43% - X343 - *Add'tl Info. to Support a Services Review (275)*

SUMMARY OF RESULTS: 4C

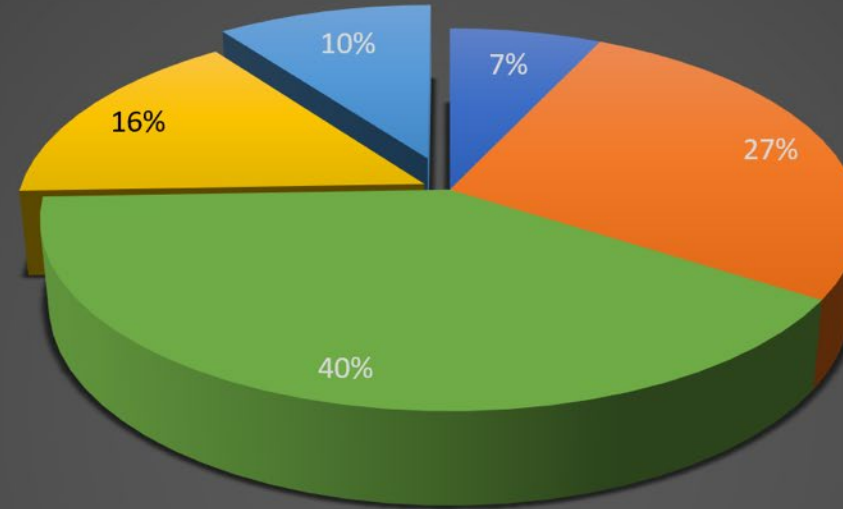
Of the non-mandated guides listed, which would benefit your organization if mandated?

→ A majority of Clearinghouse and VAN respondents indicate mandating six of these guides would benefit them:

- 69% - X327 - *Services Review – Inquiry and Response (278)*
- 69% - X328 - *Services Review – Notification and Acknowledgment (278)*
- 63% - X330 - *Claim Acknowledgment (277)*
- 69% - X340 - *Request for Add'tl Information (277)*
- 56% - X341 - *Add'tl Info. to Support a Claim (275)*
- 56% - X343 - *Add'tl Info. to Support a Services Review (275)*

SUMMARY OF RESULTS: 5

The majority support the use of alternate syntaxes with certification by X12 or ANSI-accredited developer



- Yes, regardless of whether the alternative syntax supports interoperability.
- Yes, as long as an ANSI-accredited National Standards Developer certifies their alternative syntax supports the same data requirements as the associated X12 EDI Standard transaction to ensure interoperability.
- Yes, as long as X12 certifies the alternative syntax supports the same data requirements as the associated X12 EDI Standard transaction to ensure interoperability.
- No, all trading partners should use the X12 EDI Standard transactions to exchange data.
- I am ambivalent about alternative syntaxes.
