The group decided to turn this into a global change for all billing provider NM108 and MN109 across guides. We will need to review all of the billing provider NM1s and add them to the IA sheet for this MR before submitting to support for SC X12N vote.         </li> </ul> <p>Note# 350165- SITUATIONAL RULE: Required when NM109 is used. If not required by this implementation guide, do not send.</p>



Note# 44- SITUATIONAL RULE: Required for providers in the United States or its territories when the provider is eligible to receive a National Provider Identifier (NPI).

Required for providers not in the United States or its territories when the provider has received an NPI. If not required by this implementation guide, do not send.

This MR requested to add in the note above however during the discussion, the group made the decision that we don't need this note in any of the PER segments. It was put in the 007010 guide when the standard DE increased to 2048 from 256 in 005010. We don't believe there is a reason to have this restriction in the guides so we are going to remove the note instead. This note only seems to be in the 837 guides. We will get a list and place that list in the IA document.
